

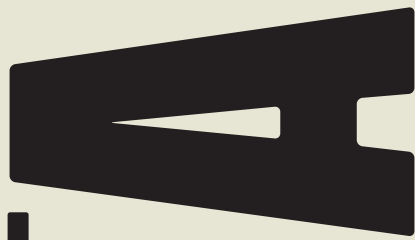

► **In-Between Empires: Trans-imperial History in a Global Age**

Whereas national history has been transnationalized in the past decades, the same does not hold true for the history of empires. By focusing on spaces “in-between” empires—their connectivity, cooperation, and competition—this two-day workshop aims at establishing a “trans-imperial” approach to the historical study of empires. It brings together an international group of scholars who have focused on trans-imperial themes regarding empires such as the British, French, Japanese, German, Portuguese, and Ottoman empires.
