Current Research Projects



Knowledge Transfer in the Context of Differentiation and Institutionalization in 16th and 17th century Korea

Funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG)

The second year of the current phase of the Collaborative Research Center (CRC) 980 "Episteme in Motion" (SFB 980) at the Freie Universität Berlin proved to be quite busy for Eun-Jeung Lee, Vladimir Glomb and Martin Gehlmann. Besides active work in two conceptual study groups, the project members participated in the organization and realization of the annual conference of the CRC under the theme "Wissensoikonomien – Order and Transgression in Premodern Culture" in June 2018. Together with CRC researchers from Jewish, German Literature, and Arabic Studies a workshop on the topic of "Performing Economies. Changing and Exchanging Goods in Pre-Modern Ritual Communites" was conducted. In the workshop Martin Gehlmann presented on the Korean Scholar Yi Önjök (1491-1553) and rituals in his honor at different Korean Confucian academies (sŏwŏn) and later discussed how rituals can be viewed as practices of exchange.

Already in May 2018 an international conference titled "What is an Academy? Early Modern Learned Societies in a Transcultural Perspective" was organized to look at the phenomenon of academies from an interdisciplinary perspective (see separate report). In October 2018 the research team, together with a delegation from the CRC and one from Nagoya University, traveled to South Korea for conference participation and a fieldtrip to Confucian Academies in the Andong area. After a first workshop at the Academy of Korean Studies in Songnam the delegation moved to Andong at the invitation of the Korean Studies Institute. After an introduction to the wooden printing plates stored by the Institute, close by Tosan Academy and the traditional manor of Kim Hakbong were visited by the group. After the return to Seoul the SNU-FU KoreaNet Workshop 2018 was held at the Kyujanggak Institute of Seoul National University (see separate report).

Further research efforts include a trip to North Korea as part of the FU participation in the "International Conference on the Development of Science and Human Welfare" at Kim II Sung University in September 2018 (see separate report). After the conference the project members could visit three Confucian academies and gain valuable information on the state of conservation and research on Confucian academies in North Korea. Martin Gehlmann received a scholarship from Hunan University in Changsha, PRC and stayed from March to June 2018 at this important center of Confucian academy studies in China to further his dissertation research.

Sharing the German Government's Documents on Unification and Integration

Funded by the Ministry of Unification, Republic of Korea Since 2010

As unification remains a keyword in Korea, the German "Turn" of 1989/90 is a continual focus for research. Since 2010, the Institute of Korean Studies at Freie Universität Berlin has produced a comprehensive collection of documents on Germany's reunification process. Set off and financed by the South Korean Government, this project is attempting to elucidate policies and measures taken by federal, regional, and municipal governments and other institutions to facilitate the merger of political, economic, social, and other systems of the two German countries. In 2018, the Institute of Korean Studies presented six new volumes in the Korean edition, covering the topics of migration, social class fluctuation, legislation of DDR for unification, judicial system, federal prime minister's office, and building federal states. And with new six volumes, this project, including 30 volumes, has been completed.

GEnKO German-Korean Partnership Programme 2018

Funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD)

The Institute of Korean Studies (FU) and the Institute for Peace and Unification Studies (SNU) established the ongoing research cooperation on the "Museumization of Memories – Dealing and Promotion of Peace" in 2017. The project is supported by the GEnKO program for two years (2017-18), funded by the German Academic Exchange Program (DAAD).

The overall purpose of the program is the promotion of bilateral cooperation and partnership between German and Korean universities.

In 2018, the Institute of Korean Studies sent one graduate student and one PhD candidate to Korea. The MA student Hannah Burchhardt had the opportunity to study at the SNU for one term as an exchange student. The PhD candidate Irene Maier spent one month at the SNU for fieldwork regarding her thesis on Ernst Fraenkel and his time in Korea. She investigated the way in which the periods of Korean history relevant to Fraenkel's life and work in Korea - the so-called "period of liberation" or "period of the US military government" from 1945 until the foundation of the Republic of Korea in 1948 as well as the first years of the Republic of Korea until the outbreak of the Korean War - and Fraenkel's fields of activity are represented in museums and state memorial sites and documented in state and university archives.

International Conferences and Workshops

11-12 May 2018:

"The Political in the Institutionalization and Ritualization of Public Remembrance"

From May 11 to 12, 2018 the Institute of Korean Studies together with the Department of Korean Studies at Ruhr-Universität-Bochum held the international workshop "The Political in the Institutionalization and Ritualization of Public Remembrance" as part of the AKS research project "Transcoding as Cultural and Social Practice".

The conference consisted of three panels with each panel illuminating different aspects of public remembrance. To broaden the scope and looking beyond Korea two internationally renowned experts have also been invited for the discussion of their paper. Miranda Brown (University of Michigan) gave a fascinating insight into "The Meaning of Ritual and Public Remembrance in Classical China". Also, Maoz Azaryahu (University of Haifa) held an intriguing presentation on "Mount Herzl: The Creation of Israel's National Cemetery".




22-23 May 2018:

"What is an Academy? Early Modern Learned Societies in a Transcultural Perspective"

Organized by the projects A07, B05 and C09 of the CRC 980 "Episteme in Motion"

This international conference was jointly organized by members of the CRC from three different projects conducting research on various educational institutions subsumed under the name "Academy" in Europe and Asia. After the research team of the project "Knowledge Transfer in the Context of Differentiation and Institutionalization in 16th and 17th century Korea" had organized a conference on Confucian academies in East Asia in 2017, this conference was designed to provide a more interdisciplinary view on the matter. Although scholars in the last decades have begun to study academies in a comparative perspective, they have often tended to consider these institutions as regional (or national) modifications of a given institutional type. In contrast, the conference asked participants to explore how the specific features of academies were shaped by a dialogue between historical models and contemporary socio-cultural contexts. The conference was conceived in the framework of the Collaborative Research Centre "Episteme in Motion", which, investigating processes of knowledge transformation in premodern cultures, is dedicated to showing how transformations of knowledge do indeed take place continuously even in societies that describe themselves and their cultural practices as stable. Contributions during the conference ranged from presentations on Jesuit Academies in Asia to literary societies in early modern Europe and Spanish art academies in the 18th century.



8 June 2018:

First Annual Kim Dae Jung Lecture – Myeong-Sook Han

This year the Institute of Korean Studies held their first Annual Kim Dae Jung Lecture on June 8th 2018.

As former Prime Minister Han Myeong-Sook has said in her speech the Freie Universität Berlin, to honor the special relationship between the University and late Korean president Kim Dae Jung, has decided to hold a Kim Dae Jung Lecture annually starting this year. Kim Dae Jung introduced his Sunshine Policy towards North Korea when he visited the Freie Universität Berlin in 2000. As Germany shares the history of national division Kim Dae Jung's vision and efforts towards a united Korean peninsula are deeply intertwined with German support for Korean reunification.

The lecture opened with a welcoming by Professor Lee Eun-Jeung followed by a greeting and a video message by Mrs. Lee Hee-ho, Kim Dae Jung's widow and former First Lady of the Republic of Korea where she thanked the audience and the University for honoring her late husband's memory and legacy.

Honorary Guest and Speaker Han Myeong-Sook talked about her own experience as the Minister for Women under Kim Dae Jung and about his lifelong struggle for peace and democracy on the Korean peninsula. She mentioned her family's escape from North Korea before the war and that she personally was involved in the fight for the democratization and the help they received from Germany with that.

Following herspeech, Han Myeong-Sook participated in a discussion with Dr Norbert Baas (Ambassador for Germany in the Republic of Korea 2006-2009).





2 October 2018:

Berlin Forum on Korea/ Korea Global Forum – "Peace and Security on the Korean Peninsula and Korean Unification"



In cooperation with Ministry of Unification (ROK), The Institute for Far Eastern Studies of Kyungnam University, University of North Korean Studies

This year's Berlin Forum on Korea was jointly organized with the Institute for Far Eastern Studies of Kyungnam University of North Korean Studies' Korea Global Forum Program on October 2nd 1018 under the banner of "Peace and Security on the Korean Peninsula and Korean Unification".

After a welcoming speech by his excellency Dr. Bumgoo Jong (Ambassador of the Republic of Korea in Berlin) and a keynote speech by Hae-Sung Chun (Viceminister, Ministry of Unification of the Republic of Korea) renowned experts in the fields of unification studies, peace and conflict research, North Korea studies and political science discussed the issues of dialogue, cooperation and peacekeeping as well as denuclearization and peacekeeping on the Korean peninsula in two consecutive panel sessions.

30 October 2018:

SNU-FU KoreaNet Workshop 2018

Organized together with the Kyujanggak Institute of Seoul National University

The FU KoreaNet Workshop in 2018 was held at the Kyujanggak Institute for Korean Studies at Seoul National University. As part of a field- and research trip to Korea scholars from Freie Universität Berlin, Nagoya University, Sungkyunkwan University, and Seoul National University participated in the workshop. After an introduction by the director of the Kyujanggak Institute Prof Lee Hyeon-hie, Kristiane Hasselmann introduced the concept and research of the CRC 980 "Episteme in Motion". The morning session was then devoted to Confucian academies as Prof Lee Sanghae spoke about the architecture of the academies and Vladimir Glomb commented on the state of research on North Korean academies. During the afternoon session general research on manuscript culture and language was presented. Martin Gehlmann talked about Songdang Pak Yöng (1471-1540) and his early reception of Chinese academy regulations in northern Korea. Prof Abe Yasuro and Prof Ikeuchi Satoshi then introduced their projects for manuscript restauration and preservation in Japan inviting Korean scholars to join their efforts. The workshop was rounded up by a presentation on pre-modern language textbooks by Prof Horst Simon of FU Berlin.



8 November 2018:

"Book Launching: Conscience in Action – The Autobiography of Kim Dae-Jung"

In collaboration with the Kim Dae-Jung Presidential Library & Museum

On November 8, 2018, the Institute of Korean Studies, in cooperation with the Kim Dae-jung Presidential Library at Yonsei University, held a book launch event introducing, for the first time, the English translation of former South Korean President Kim Dae-jung's autobiography "Conscience in Action". Following an introduction by Prof. Lee Eun-Jeung and Prof. Park Myung-lim, both South Korea's Ambassador to Germany, Dr. Jong Bum Goo, and former South Korean Prime Minister Han Myung- sook, shared personal memories on their relationship with the late Kim Dae-jung. The laudation was given by Dr Werner Pfennig, a former researcher at Freie Universität Berlin, who himself had known Kim Dae-jung personally.

2-3 March 2018:

20-21 April 2018:

PBBP Workshop for Graduate Student in Korean Studies together with students from Yonsei University

Supported by The Academy of Korean Studies

Under the auspices of the AKS Core University Program Project Transcoding as Cultural and Social Practice, a joint colloquium by students and members of Ruhr-University Bochum (RUB), the Institut national des langues et civilisations orientales (Inalco, Paris), Yonsei University (Seoul) and Charles University Prague (CUP) was held at the Korean Studies institutes of Freie Universität Berlin (FU Berlin), on April 21st and 22nd. Summer School: Europe & Korea Young Leaders' Forum 2018

Gendered Legacy and Future of Unification in Korea

The summer school took place from 15 to 22 August in 2018 in cooperation with the Department of Sociology of Yonsei University, Seoul. This programme was designed to offer opportunities to understand the genealogy of academic and activist problematization of the issue of "Comfort Women" in Korea. It was attended by nine students from Freie Universität Berlin, one student from Ruhr-Universität Bochum, one from Charles University in Prague, and two students from the Institut National des Langues et Civilisations Orientales in Paris. Participants started the summer school programme by visiting the Wednesday Rally for "Comfort Women" held in front of the Japanese embassy in Seoul. Participants also visited the Seodaemun Prison History Hall and the War and Women's Human Rights Museum. The lectures of the summer school dealt with the following themes:

Gender in Korea, Gendering Korea (Professor Kim Hyun Mee, Yonsei University), "Comfort Women" and the Global World (Dr Sakamoto Chizuko, Yonsei University), The "Comfort Station" System of the Japanese Imperial Army (Dr Yoon Myong-Sook), The Public Prostitution System under Japanese Colonial Rule (Dr Park Jung-Ae, Northeast Asian History Foundation), Hot War, Cold War, and Patriotic Prostitutes: the Military Prostitution System in Postcolonial Korea (Professor Park Jeong-Mi, Chungbuk University), The Representation of "Comfort Women" (Professor Kwon Eun-Sun, Choongbu University), The Girl Statues: Politics and Ethics of Representation (Jung Eun-Young, Artist). What the participants felt and learned will be published soon as the working paper of IKS.



October 2018:

LTI Essay Contest

In 2018, the annual essay contest sponsored by the Literature Translation Institute of Korea (LTI Korea) was organized by Frankfurt University. The participants could choose between Kim Ae-ran's novel "My Palpitating Life" and Cheon Woon-Young's short story collection "How She Uses Her Tears". Among the many participants were eight students enrolled at the IKS; three of them were awarded one of the total number of eight prizes: Both Second Prizes went to Delia Wartmann and Anne Zanner, and one of the three Third Prizes went to Laura Perello.

22-25 November 2018:

Professional development Program for German Secondary School Teachers in Social Studies and Related Subjects

Supported by KF

This year's Workshop, which has been held for the eighth time since 2010, attracted twenty-one participants from six Laender. The intensive program covered a wide range of Korean topics that would be essential for German social educators, for example, eight lectures (all by the IKS' own staff) were held on all relevant fields to provide an overview of Korea and its history and culture, politics, and economics. Three special workshops were added, where additional input was given. Teachers spoke about their experiences with the topic of "Korea" in their classrooms, they learnt about school-life experiences in Korea, and they spoke about the documentary by Pierre-Olivier François "Korea – Forever Divided?" The visit to the Korean Cultural Center was one of the highlights of the workshop, with a kayagum performance, short movie clips about Korea and the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics, and some exercises in Hangeul calligraphy.



Academy of Unification Training Program

Lessons of the German Reunification and the Korean Peninsula





By now, the Annual Training Program, which is financed by the South Korean government and conducted by the Institute of Korean Studies at Freie Universität Berlin, launched in 2010 to provide perspectives regarding contextualized data as well as policies, administrative arrangements, institutions, and ideas of the German Unification, has grown into a successful and well-established part of the academic research and knowledge transfers. In the interest of understanding and adapting the knowledge of the past situation between the DDR and the BRD in Germany in comparison to the current, ongoing situation between North and South Korea, the program was structured and consolidated through the DFG transfer project T03 "Knowledge Transfer as Intercultural Translation: Development of Exemplary Practices of Transformation-preparing Activities in Korea" from 2013 to 2015.The program consisted of South Korean officials, who were introduced to several German institutions in which they got to work with documents and files concerning their research topic. Furthermore, they were able to participate in interviews with politicians and various kind of experts in their area of their research, participate in different seminars and workshops, and they had the opportunity to visit different historical sites with guided tours provided.

Public Relations and International Networking

Accompanying the Federal President on his official visit to Seoul and Pyeongchang

From 7 to 11 February 2018, Federal President Frank-Walter Steinmeier and his wife Elke Büdenbender visited the Republic of Korea on the occasion of the XXIII Olympic Winter Games in Pyeongchang, which, thanks to the unexpected participation of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, had come to represent an opportunity for thawing the frozen relations between the North and the South. At the invitation of the Federal President's Office, Prof Dr Eun-Jeung Lee accompanied the Federal President and his wife on this official visit to Seoul and Pyeongchang, including to a series of meetings and discussions with high-ranking Korean officials, foremost amongst them the President of the Republic of Korea, Moon Jae In, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, and the Speaker of the National Assembly. Such talks focused mainly on the relations between North and South Korea and the German experience of policies of détente and, ultimately, of national reunification. Prof Lee also accompanied the Federal President and his wife to the opening ceremony of the Olympic Winter Games and to various functions and events aimed at providing opportunities to encounter and experience Korean culture and tradition.

From the end of September to the beginning of October 2018, a delegation from the IKS visited North Korea to participate in the International Conference at Kim Il-Sung University in Pyongyang. Besides giving presentations and participating in the discussions of the various panels the group also went for several excursions related to research topics on Korean history, politics, and cultural heritage. After the conference a Letter of Intent between Freie Universität Berlin and Kim Il-Sung University was signed to encourage further cooperation between both institutions.

Prof Dr Jean Young Kim - Yonsei University

Kim Jean Young is professor of Russian Literature at Yonsei University. She holds BA from Wheaton College (Mass.), MA and PhD from Yale University. The field of her specialization is Pushkin and Russian poetry, but for the last decade it has expanded to the comparative study of Russian and Korean literatures, as is demonstrated in the recent book Siberian Nostalgia: Russian Literature during the Colonial Time in Korea, 1896-1946.



Prof Dr Hyo-Je Cho - Sungkonghoe University

Cho Hyo-Je is professor of sociology at SungKongHoe University Seoul. He has written extensively on the subjects of human rights and civil society. Among his published works are Horizons of Human Rights (2016), Contemporary South Korean Society (2013), In Search of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights for the Young Generation (2011). Cho was closely involved in the establishment of the National Human Rights Commission of Korea, and worked as special advisor for Amnesty International Korea. He also served in the Policy Panel for the Ministry of Justice, and the Human Rights Committee of Seoul Metropolitan Government. Dr Cho studied politics, international relations and sociology at London University, Oxford University, and the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE).



Prof Dr Chang-nam Kim - SungKongHoe University

Kim Chang-nam is professor in the Department of Media and Communication at SungKongHoe University in Seoul. He holds BA in Business Administration, MA and PhD in Communication from Seoul National University. Besides, Professor Kim made his name in the history of Korean pop music, having been one of the leaders of a band in the 1980s that played a role in South Korea's democratization movement: "People who seek music" (Norae-rul ch'annun saram-dul). He is also the president of one of the most distinguished awards shows in Korea, Korean Music Awards.



Namil Kim - Visiting Writer

Kim Nam-il made his literary debut in 1983 when his short story "Beri" (Berry) appeared in the journal Literature of Our Age. He published his first novel Cheongnyeon ilgi (Diary of Youth) in 1987, and has since written various works of fiction, nonfiction, and literary journalism. He is also a senior researcher at Asia Culture Network. He received numerous honors including the Jeon Tae-il Literary Award for Reporting and the Gwon Jeong-saeng Creative Writing Fund.



Former Prof Dr Hagen Koo – University of Hawaii at Manoa

Hagen Koo is emeritus professor of sociology at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. Born in Korea, he received his BA in Korea and worked as a journalist briefly before coming to America, where he received his PhD at Northwestern University. He published extensively on social transformation in South Korea during the era of rapid industrialization.



Prof Dr Carey Park - Hongik University

Carey Park is a Research Professor at the Research Center for the Arts of Hongik University. She has previously worked as visiting professor at the Department of Intangible Cultural Heritage Studies of the Korea National University of Cultural Heritage and as a curator at Ewha Womans University Museum. She holds a PhD from the Department of Art History of Ewha Womans University. Her work in the field of North Korean Art includes "Propaganda Posters and Visual Agitation Studying the Process of Internalizing Agitation Propaganda through Relational Aesthetics", "Modification in Icons and Forms in the North Korea Art with Policy Change", "Baekdu Mountain: The Invention of Tradition and the emblems".



Prof Dr Youngseo Baik - Yonsei University

Baik Youngseo is professor of East Asian History at Yonsei University. He holds BA and PhD from Seoul National University. Formerly he was a professor at Hallym University, and Chief Editor, Quarterly Creation and Criticism.



Prof Dr Myung-soo Yang – Ewha Womans University

Since 1999, Myung-soo Yang is professor of theology at Ewha Womans University. After graduating from Department of Law at Seoul National University, he received his MA from Methodist Theological University, and ThD at University of Strasbourg.
