## Current Research Projects

### Knowledge Transfer in the Context of Differentiation and Institutionalization in 16th and 17th Century Korea

Funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG)

The second year of the current phase of the Collaborative Research Center (CRC) 980 "Episteme in Motion" (SFB 980) at the Freie Universität Berlin proved to be quite busy for Eun-Jeung Lee, Vladimir Glomb and Martin Gehlmann. Besides active work in two conceptual study groups, the project members participated in the organization and realization of the annual conference of the CRC under the theme "Wissensokonomien – Order and Transgression in Premodern Culture" in June 2018. Together with CRC researchers from Jewish, German Literature, and Arabic Studies a workshop on the topic of "Performing Economies. Changing and Exchanging Goods in Pre-Modern Ritual Communities" was conducted. In the workshop Martin Gehlmann presented on the Korean Scholar Yi Ŏnjök (1491-1553) and rituals in his honor at different Korean Confucian academies (söwön) and later discussed how rituals can be viewed as practices of exchange.



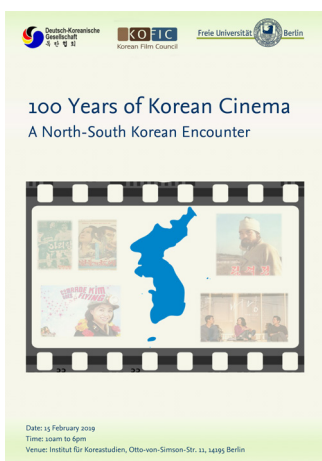

## 100 Years of Korean Cinema A North South Korean Encounter

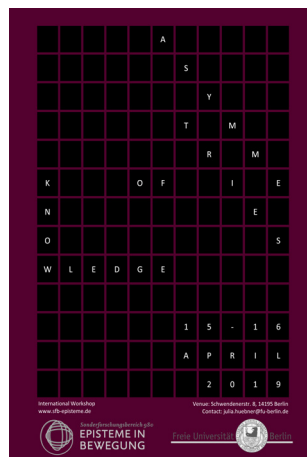

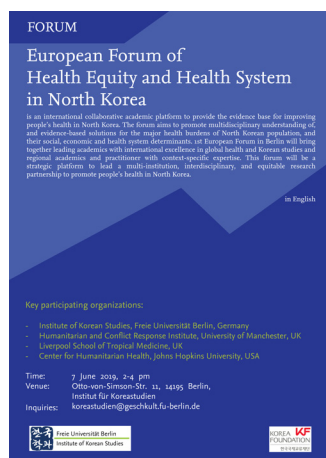
## Asymmetries of Knowledge

The objective of the workshop is to survey knowledge asymmetries and their manifestations within different contexts and from diverse angles as well as to document the process of their emergence, legitimization and dissolution. Knowledge asymmetries are not only to be viewed from a pedagogical perspective, but also with explicit references to other factors, such as social correlatives (age, power, money, etc.). Special focus is placed on different theoretical and/or comparative approaches to 'cultural specific' (East – West) or 'historiographical' (historical – modern) aspects. The interdisciplinary orientation of the workshop invites multifaceted treatments of the topic of knowledge asymmetries from all perspectives.



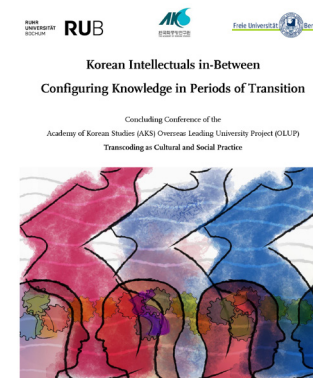

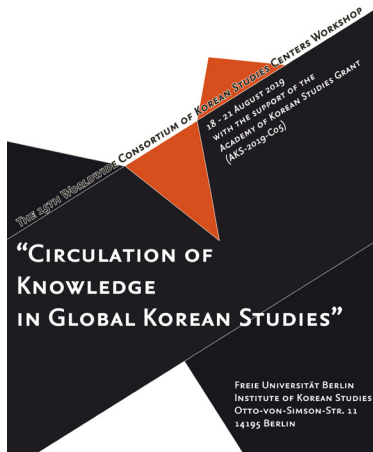

## Circulation of Knowledge in Global Korean Studies - The 15th Worldwide Consortium of Korean Studies Centers Workshop

This interdisciplinary workshop, which has as its theme “Circulation of Knowledge in Global Korean Studies”, has a primary goal of fostering of a new generation of Korean Studies scholars with a shared sense of mission and a more global perspective on Korea. To that end, it will bring together graduate students and faculty from 20 universities in 15 different countries to share their research and their sense of the issues in Korean Studies. A second goal of the workshop is to promote the development of Korean Studies in Eastern Europe, a region where many people are showing strong interests in Korea but which, despite long tradition of Korean Studies, lacks strong, comprehensive Korean Studies programs. To that end, the workshop will seek to have the participation of graduate students from several Eastern European countries so they can be exposed to the level of Korean Studies in Korea as well as in other countries where Korean Studies is relatively well established.

## Security in Northeast Asia and South Korea's Role as Middle Power – Korea-Germany Strategic Dialogue

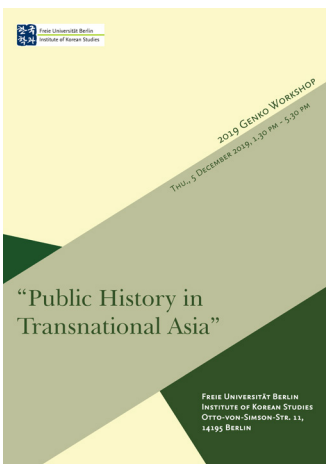
The Institute for National Security Strategy (INSK, Seoul), the Institute for Korean Studies (IKS, Freie Universität Berlin) and the Stiftung Wissenschaft und Politik (SWP, Berlin) organised the Strategic Dialogue Korea-Germany with the theme: „International Relations and Security in Northeast Asia and Korea as Middle Power“. The aim of the dialogue was to address issues of strategic interest for relations between the countries in the region. German and Korean experts from SWP and IKS participated in the dialogue.

The dialogue has addressed regional alliance structures and strategic interests as well as the role of Korea as a middle power in the China-Japan-Korea security complex and possible new approaches in security-building measures and cooperation mechanisms between the states in Northeast Asia among themselves and with the European Union.

The network grew out of the first European Forum of Health Equity and Health System in North Korea held in Berlin in June 2019. The Forum, which is designed as a strategic platform to lead a multi-institutional, interdisciplinary, and equitable research partnership to promote people's health in North Korea, brought together leading academics with international excellence in global health and Korean Studies and regional academics and practitioners with context-specific expertise.

Under the auspices of the AKS Core University Program Project Transcoding as Cultural and Social Practice, a joint colloquium by students and members of Ruhr-University Bochum (RUB), the Institut national des langues et civilisations orientales (Inalco, Paris), Yonsei University (Seoul) and Charles University Prague (CUP) was held at the Korean Studies institutes of Freie Universität Berlin (FU Berlin), on March 15th and 16th. The colloquium, directed by Prof Marion Eggert (RUB), Prof Lee Eun-Jeung (FU Berlin), Prof Kim Daeyeol (Inalco), Prof Miriam Löwensteinová (CUP), and Prof Dongno Kim (Yonsei University), thus brought together M.A.-students and PhD-candidates from different countries and universities and offered them the valuable opportunity to present their latest research, discuss their current or upcoming projects and theses, and enter into academic exchange with other graduate students from Korean Studies institutes involved in the research consortium.

### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR GERMAN SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHERS IN SOCIAL STUDIES AND RELATED SUBJECTS

This year's Workshop, which has been held for the eighth time since 2010, attracted twenty-one participants from six Länder. The intensive program covered a wide range of Korean topics that would be essential for German social educators, for example, eight lectures (all by the IKS' own staff) were held on all relevant fields to provide an overview of Korea and its history and culture, politics, and economics. Three special workshops were added, where additional input was given. Teachers spoke about their experiences with the topic of "Korea" in their classrooms, they learnt about school-life experiences in Korea, and they spoke about the documentary by Pierre-Olivier François "Korea – Forever Divided?" The visit to the Korean Cultural Center was one of the highlights of the workshop, with a kayagŭm performance, short movie clips about Korea and the Pyeongchang Winter Olympics, and some exercises in Hangeul calligraphy.





## ACADEMY OF UNIFICATION TRAINING PROGRAM

By now, the Annual Training Program, which is financed by the South Korean government and conducted by the Institute of Korean Studies at Freie Universität Berlin, launched in 2010 to provide perspectives regarding contextualized data as well as policies, administrative arrangements, institutions, and ideas of the German Unification, has grown into a successful and well-established part of the academic research and knowledge transfers. In the interest of understanding and adapting the knowledge of the past situation between the DDR and the BRD in Germany in comparison to the current, ongoing situation between North and South Korea, the program was structured and consolidated through the DFG transfer project T03 "Knowledge Transfer as Intercultural Translation."

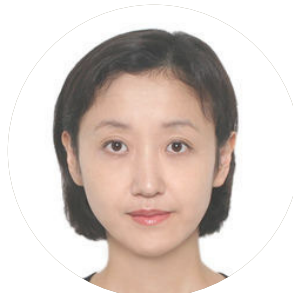
