Then the MA program “Archaeology of the Ancient World” is your choice.

Why? Study *in English* at the **highest-ranking** German university in the field of archaeology! (QS World University Rankings 2022)

You will learn about all disciplines involved (Classical Archaeology, Near Eastern Archaeology or Prehistoric Archaeology) and focus on one of them in particular. Integrative aspects bring all three disciplines together to explore common topics and theoretical approaches. In the complementary area you will select courses from adjacent disciplines.

To apply, you need to hold a university degree (e.g., a BA) comprising of at least **180 ECTS**, at least **60 of which** are **relevant** to an **archaeological** discipline. The complete program is taught in English: you need to certify C1 English language proficiency.
